Guidelines for Abstract Submission:

Abstract should be submitted in a structured format. It should include background and objectives, methods (brief description of the study design including data collection method(s) used, a brief description of the statistical methods), a summary of the results, and a conclusion and 5 -8 keywords. Abstracts may relate to one of the following sub-thematic areas:

Conference theme: Advancing public health through information revolution.

Conference sub-themes:

1. Evidence on communicable (TB, HIV/AIDS, Malaria and others) and non-communicable diseases, and injury in Ethiopia.
2. Quality of health system research and service in Ethiopia.
3. Evidence on the innovations of traditional medicine in Ethiopia.
4. Evidence on nutrition-sensitive and specific research/interventions on double-duty actions.
5. Evidence on Public health surveillance and disease intelligence for action and response of public health emergencies.
6. Evidence on Antimicrobial Drug Resistance.
7. Advancing data Management for informed decision-making.

Abstracts can be submitted either for a poster presentation or for oral presentation. Poster presentations should fit to A1 size paper (120 cm ht and 80 cm width). Detailed guidelines for preparing a poster and oral presentations can be obtained from EPHI website or by mailing to the email provided below. Authors should use the templet given below to submit your abstracts.

Deadline for submission of abstract until the midnight of **31th December 2018**.

A detailed guideline for preparing and submitting abstracts for oral and poster presentation:

1. Abstracts must be in English and single-spaced.
2. Begin the heading with the title in UPPER CASE and not longer than 30 words. Give the name(s) and affiliation(s) of the author(s) and underline the name of only the person presenting.
3. Begin abstract on a new line.
4. Abstract should be submitted in a structured format. It should include: background and objective, a brief description of the study design including data collection method(s) used, a brief description of the statistical methods, a summary of the results, and a conclusion.
5. Abstracts must be submitted within the border on the form provided. Abstract text should be limited to 350 words, excluding keywords.
6. Authors must specify whether they submit their abstract for oral or poster session.
7. All abbreviations and acronyms must be spelled out upon first-time use.
8. A completed author identification form must accompany submitted abstract.

Abstract review and selection process:

Abstracts will be judged by peer reviewers. Authors will be notified of acceptance or rejection of abstracts. Abstracts accepted for this Congress will be published in the abstract book. Authors are responsible for providing a substitute presenter if the corresponding author or original designee is unable to present.

Funding for presenters:

The fund is available to support travel and per diem for individuals coming from outside of Addis Ababa to present abstracts.
